

TEXT OF INTENT TO CIRCULATE PETITION  
City Elector/Voters Proposed City Charter Amendments

Whereas the nonpartisan City Charter enacted election rules of law are in conflict with the nonpartisan Municipal Elections Code Article-8 Sections 8140 through 8143 rules of law - And specifically when (4) other Municipal Agency elections take place simultaneously, with-in the Chartered City boundaries:

The following City Charter Amendments, are also self-explaining.

PROPOSED CITY CHARTER CHANGES

A) Shall all relevant Charter Article II Sections be completely deleted of any wording related to "Limitation On Term of Mayor, or On Terms of Council Members" serves, and be amended with the following wording: ("Life-Time Term Limits" of (2) consecutive' (4) year elected or appointed Life-Time Terms for the office of a Mayor or Council Member Serves?)

B) Shall the City Charter be amended by adding a (New Article II Section 285), and making the "Mayor or Council Member" clearly-ineligible to 'seek' another elected public office, prior to or before vacating her or his present appointed or elected' public office?

C) Shall all relevant City Charter Article Sections be intirely deleted of any wording related to "boundaries or individual City Council Members District;" When using the fillowing nonpartisan wording, and be amended by (replacing the present City Council-(6) "nonpartisan" Districts by forming only (1) "nonpartisan" At-Large City Council District?

D) Shall all relevant City Charter Article Sections be intirely deleted in order to be properly amended to lawfully Elect' At-Large any "Mayor or (6) Council Members"(as) based on a (1) vote simple Majority election: Also, maintain the "Plurality Voters Calculation Requirements." Mainly to amend any wording, with-in the City Charter that does not defend the Elector/Voter's "Non-Partisan" local level Election Process?

The proposed initiative City Charter Changes are Marked A, B, C. and D. Obviously are also relatively in proper order to so be placed on the Elector/Voter ballot as a "group" and require a simple majority vote, be it YES for approval, and NO for non-approval.
